SUMMER PROGRAMS













MORNING ESL (\$360 per week)

This half-day program emphasizes practical speaking, listening, reading, vocabulary and writing skills. Students will participate in activities focused on such themes as Canada, the community, the environment, and British Columbia. Students are assessed at the beginning of their program. In addition, students will be evaluated weekly and receive a Certificate of Completion and a report card at the end of their program. Medical insurance is included.

MORNING ESL WITH AFTERNOON CULTURAL ACTIVITY PROGRAM (\$650 per week)

Afternoon Activities and Canadian Cultural Program is an opportunity to experience Canadian culture and use newly learned English skills and vocabulary by participating in group activities and by exploring the beautiful outdoors of the Lower Mainland area of British Columbia. The Afternoon Cultural Program includes activities such as swimming, golfing, tennis, bowling, hiking, team sports, and crafts as well as bus trips to popular sightseeing areas such as Gastown; Stanley Park; the Vancouver Aquarium; Capilano Suspension Bridge the University of British Columbia; and the H.R. MacMillan Space Centre. Medical insurance is included.

Time: 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Classes begin weekly

FULL DAY INTENSIVE ESL (\$1,400 per session)

Students will be immersed in English as a Second Language classes and taught necessary and useful skills for success in the regular school system. Students will learn about Canadian history, geography, and culture to gain background information for social studies courses. Canadian culture, mannerisms and cultural diversity will also be explored. Furthermore, students will learn successful study skills such as note taking, test preparation, test taking, paragraph and essay writing, and many other relevant skills. Students are assessed at the beginning of their program and evaluated weekly. Each student receives a Certificate of Completion and a Report Card at the end of the session. Medical insurance is included.

Time: 8:30 am to 2:00 pm Session 1: July (4 weeks) • Session 2: August (4 weeks)

TOEFL® Prep (\$375 per week)

This course will help prepare students for the TOEFL® Test. All students will be given a diagnostic test to identify skill areas that need to be worked on. During class, students learn about the different types of questions in all four of the computer-based TOEFL® sections (Listening, Structure, Reading, and Essay). They learn how the internet-based version of the test is structured, how to better understand the test directions and how to use time management skills for the test. Skill activities will be used to improve test performance. Practice tests will be given to simulate an actual TOEFL® Test. Students should expect daily homework in this course. Students will receive a Certificate of Completion at the end of the course. Medical insurance is included.

Time: 8:30 am to 2:00 pm Classes begin weekly.

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AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITY PROGRAM 2 PM to 4:30 PM (\$200 per week) (Students must be registered in a full day ESL program to participate in this program)

Afternoon activities can be combined with the Intensive ESL program, TOEFL® class or Advanced English Skills classes to create a complete, full day ESL experience. Medical insurance is included.

This program is highly recommended for those students staying in homestay programs and for those students requiring full day supervi-

Afternoon Athletics, Activities, and Culture Program: This program features Canadian Sports, cooperative games, outings, and Canadian cultural activities. Together with their all day English classes, this provides students with an opportunity to use newly learned English skills by participating in individual and team sports and learning about Canadian culture. Students will have an opportunity to increase their vocabulary and practice their speaking skills with teachers, staff and Canadian students. Athletic Activities include: Golf, Bowling, Soccer, Badminton, Basketball, Lacrosse, Hockey and much more. Cultural Activities include: Canadian Cooking, Movies, Western Dancing, African Drumming, arts and crafts and much more.

ADVANCED ENGLISH SKILLS - HIGH SCHOOL (\$1,400 per session) - non-credit

This Advanced English Skills course is designed to help prepare students for high school English at the grade 9,10 or 11 level. Students will participate in response journals, paragraph writing, essay writing, and creative writing, group discussions, group and individual presentations, poetry reading, short story reading, and novel reading. Students are assessed at the beginning of the program. Students should expect daily homework assignments and daily reading assignments. In addition, students will be tested weekly and receive a Certificate of Completion and a Report Card at the end of each session. Medical insurance is included.

A CANADIAN APPROACH TO TEACHING ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (\$350 per week)

This course is designed to complement the skills and abilities our visiting educators have teaching English. Visiting educators will be introduced to Canadian teaching pedagogies and will focus on the communicative approach to teaching English as a second language. Daily seminars will focus on techniques for teaching listening, speaking, pronunciation, multimedia, assessment, evaluation, and cooperative study. Teachers will also have the opportunity to observe Canadian classrooms, teach their students using the methods learned in class, and design and develop lessons based on the instruction they have received. All visiting teachers will receive a certificate of completion at the end of their course.
